

## Sports Premium Funding

2016/2017

At Wray Common we recognise the importance that PE has on the physical activity, health and wellbeing as well as the educational achievement of children. Our Sports Premium Funding is being spent to allow our children to become more physically active, to experience competition, to be aware of being healthy and to possess the skills that allow them to enjoy sport.

We received £10,035.04 for the academic year 2015/2016 and are expecting to receive a similar amount for the academic year 2016/2017. The following table outlines how this money is to be spent.

<b>Staff Development:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Assessment training course</li><li>• Outdoor Learning course</li><li>• Outdoor adventurous learning course</li></ul>	Assessment of learning will be more rigorous. Children have been engaging in OAA activities 'on site' and regularly rather than just on residential courses.
<b>Spare PE Kit</b> Every class has been provided with 5 sets of shorts and T-shirts with a bag.	Children are no longer missing PE lessons due to lack of kit. This allows teaching to be more consistent and progressive and ensures all the children participate in every lesson.
<b>Sports Crew Training</b>	A group of Year 6 children have had formal training to lead PE activities. They have been working with all year groups providing PE activities and coaching on a smaller scale.
<b>Playground equipment/storage</b> Skipping ropes, balls, bats and hoops have been bought to use during break and lunchtimes.	Children are engaged and active during break times. The amount of physical activity has greatly increased and observations have shown that very few children are now inactive during these times. Team work, sharing and creating games are also observed. It is also clear to see the skills that are being taught in lessons are now being practised in recreational times.
<b>RRPSSA membership</b>	Children are able to participate in local competition - Netball and football leagues. Cross Country competitions that allow all children to participate. District Sports events as well as friendly competitions organised.
<b>Youth Sport Trust Membership</b>	Gives us access to resources, training and advice. Allows us to target our Sports Premium funding.

	Support in targeting our training and ensuring better sport provision for the children.
<p><b>Competition</b> Competing in class, inter-house and inter-school is an important aspect of sport. <p><b>Clubs</b> Funding provides the management time to organise and set up sports clubs for children who have not been able to attend a club.</p>	Specialist PE clubs were set up to encourage 'non sporting' children.
<b>Specialist Coaching/Teaching</b>	Employment of specialist football coach and PE specialist during curriculum time. This has ensured the children receive expert tuition and that skills are taught progressively.
<b>Outdoor Adventurous Activities</b>	All the children in Year 3 learnt how to build dens and light fires. They were able to improve their confidence, their self-esteem and practise their team building skills.
<b>Sainsbury's School Games Gold Award</b>	If we achieve this award it will demonstrate our commitment to ensuring that all the children in school have the opportunity to compete in sport at a range of levels.
