Impact of PPG spend

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil on a termly basis through the use of our assessment system. In addition to this, assessment of social and emotional development for targeted children will be actioned. We also collate evidence from a range of monitoring activities such as learning walks, formal observations and children's PASS Survey. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the interventions put in place. Measurement of impact for the children accessing support from our Inclusion Team and/or external support will be assessed through the use of Pastoral Support Plans, Personal Education Plans, CAF and TAF reviews. The impact of PPG spending will be reported to Governors.
