Gift Suggestions

Hygiene Items - e.g. toothbrush and toothpaste, bar of wrapped soap, flannel, comb, hairbrush etc.

Other Items - e.g. hat, cap, gloves, scarf, sunglasses, hair accessories, wind up torch, sweets (must have a best before date of at least March 2017)


