Impact of PPG spend
<p><b>1. Raise standards of children’s attainment through accelerated progress in Maths</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children entitled to pupil premium progressed, as an average across the school, at 3.8 steps against an expected rate of 3.0 steps progress</li> <li>• 63% of children entitled to pupil premium in Year 6 attained end of year expectations in KS2 SATs, continuing the narrowing of the attainment gap</li> </ul> <p><b>2. Extend children’s engagement in a wide range of educational experiences</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 73% of children entitled to pupil premium in Years 5 &amp; 6 (targeted group) attended at least one after school club.</li> <li>• 96% of children entitled to pupil premium in Years 5 &amp; 6 attended their respective residential trips</li> </ul> <p><b>3. Improve attendance to above 95%%</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Attendance improved from 93% to 94%</li> </ul> <p><b>4. Develop children’s social, emotional and behavioural skills</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 60% of children identified with significant social and emotional difficulties made significant improvement</li> <li>• Evidenced improvement in children’s perception of themselves as learners and their attitudes towards school</li> </ul>
