
Google Expeditions

On Wednesday, Google Expeditions visited Wray Common with virtual reality headsets. All of the children from Year 1 and up, went on virtual expeditions to different terrains around the world. The journey was a sneak peak to our Summer 2 whole school topic, Exploring the Extraordinary! It was a great experience that was enjoyed by both children and adults!



### IF YOU'VE GOT A PROBLEM YO, WE'LL SOLVE IT!

For all of our year groups, the focus in Maths this week has been problem solving. The children have been using the 'trial by improvement method' to solve a variety of worded problems. Year 1 were challenged with making a total of 34 using the different numbers on the crabs, while Year 3 adopted a systematic approach to solve the problems they were given. Collaboration was a key contributor to the success of the tasks and all of the children proved what great mathematicians they are.



### FLOWER POWER

Year 5 have been working as scientists this week, researching, dissecting and labelling the different parts of a flower. They worked together to dissect the tulips and then stuck the different parts on to card. Using the information sheets they were given, they then identified the different parts and labelled them.
