COMPETITION TIME



THE NATIONAL MARITIME MUSEUM

During their workshop, the children heard about life on board HMS Endurance from Tim Cream, the second officer. HMS Endurance was an icebreaker that served as the Royal Navy ice patrol ship between 1991 and 2008. The children saw artefacts from many polar expeditions including a letter written by Ernest Shackleton himself.
